Cadet Check List

There are **5 Sections** to complete.

Section 1. JROTC Leadership Position for each year

Section 2. JROTC Command Organizations & Positions for each year

Section 3. Academic Extra Curricular Activities and Positions as performed in each year

Section 4. Non-Scholastic / Non-JROTC Activities & Positions as performed year round

Section 5. An Original Essay [use of AI will disqualify the candidate] by the cadet of 500 to 700 words entitled

"How JROTC has prepared me to be a better citizen of the United States"

Note: The essay must be double spaced and contain the word count at the end of the essay.

The first page of the essay must contain 1) the topic title, 2) Cadet's name 3) rank 4)unit's name and 5) name of the High School. The Cadets name must also appear on the upper right corner of each essay page.

It is **highly recommended** that the Cadet complete ALL 4 sections of the nomination form and have them reviewed by their SMI **BEFORE** starting on the essay.

Once the form and all sections are complete, **DO NOT MAIL** them anywhere. As Texas is a Pilot Program, all completed forms need to be given to your Senior Military Instructor for submission.

A signed Parental Consent Form **MUST** be attached to the completed Nomination Form.

After completing the first 4 Sections of the Nomination Form, and before starting on the Essay, the cadet must have the SMI review their work. Once the Essay is completed, the SMI needs to review the Essay for the following requirements:

- (1) 500 to 700 words
- (2) Word total at the end of the Essay
- (3) The Topic Title
- (4) Cadet's name
- (5) Cadet's rank
- (6) Unit's name
- (7) Name of the High School
- (8) The Cadet's name on the upper right hand corner of each page of the Essay.

At this point, given all of the information, is this cadet your "BEST OF THE BEST?"

IMPORTANT NOTE: AFTER THE SMI REVIEW OF ALL REQUIRED INFORMATION, A SIGNED PARENTAL RELEASE FORM MUST BE ATTACHED TO THE CADET'S PACKAGE FOR SUBMISSION

Once the SMI's review is completed, he should contact the local SAR Chapter supporting their Corps for further directions.

"Hints for Success"

- 1. The SMI must review with the Cadet the completed Nomination Form and Essay using both the SMI and Cadet's check lists.
- 2. ALL lines of the Nomination Form should have an entry.
- 3. Be very specific when listing what the Cadet has accomplished e.g.: community service, summer activities, etc. The more specific information that is provided helps the judges. General comments DO NOT assist the Cadet.
- 4. AVOID flowery descriptions when listing facts and accomplishments. *Descriptions* using a few words do not carry much influence; be specific. Use extra pages if needed.
- 5. List awards earned e.g.: Varsity Sports Letters, All State Teams, All State Chorus, VFW Medal, etc.
- 6. Endorsements by the Cadet's Principal and SMI are crucial. (example: a full page recommendation by the Principal may score 10 points where the Principals verification of the Cadets Corp GPA may only score 2 points).

It is strongly suggested that the SMI discuss this area with the Cadet's principal.

- 7. Describe the Cadets accomplishments as if justifying a military medal, NOT just the words for the citation.
- 8. Spelling and/or grammatical errors will detract from the total points awarded during judging.

Max points 10: On the Essay assigned topic of "How JROTC has prepared me to be a better citizen of the United States"

Max Points 10: Content and Flow of the Essay

Max Points 10: Grammar and Spelling

Endorsements from the School Principal and the Senior Military Instructor – Max 20 points

Max points 10: Principal's endorsement with GPA verification – 1 point. A letter describing the endorsement and why, up to a max of 9 points.

Max Points 10: Senior Military Instructor's Endorsement must verify

that the cadet is in the TOP 10% of the JROTC Class – 1 point, and include

endorsement and why, up to a maximum of 9 points.
